We have been particularly praised on our 'high-quality' support for children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. It was also highlighted that 'young children in the baby room develop secure bonds with staff.'

The nursery, located on station road, provides pre-school care and education for children between 4 months and 4 years, as well as a holiday club for children between 4 and 6 years.
